Located in the Medical Center area, this is a program dedicated to educating professional, registered nurses (R.N.) since 1903. The Baptist Health System supports the Associate degree and emphasis is on working extensively with patients in or outside of hospitals. Students complete approximately 19 credit hours of designated basic college courses in the biological and behavioral sciences at an accredited college of their choice prior to entering the School. The nursing program is completed in 5 semesters. Graduates are eligible to take the national licensure examination for registered nurses. The program is accredited by the Accrediting Bureau of Health education Schools (ABHES), approved by the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas and licensed by the Texas Workforce Commission..

The School has a history of consistently high pass rates on the national licensure examination, and graduates are highly respected and desired by employers throughout the city, state, and nation. Classes are small, permitting attention to individual student learning needs. The entire faculty is educated at the master's level with nursing expertise in their teaching fields. The relationship with the Baptist Health System allows students to learn in some of the most modern and well-equipped hospitals in the Southwest.

Make a Difference with a Career in Nursing

Registered Nurses have the opportunity to make a difference in many lives. R.N.'s promote health, prevent disease, help patients/families cope with illness, and work in a wide variety of settings. Nurses should be caring and sympathetic, able to accept responsibility, make decisions, and work with and supervise others. They need physical and emotional stability to cope with human suffering, emergencies, and other stress. Texas salaries generally range from \$30,000 (entry-level) to \$51,000 (head nurses/clinical specialists). Today's job prospects in the San Antonio region are good, with employment opportunities expected to grow faster than the average for all occupations. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics the demand for Registered Nurses is expected to grow by 623,156 jobs or 27.3% from 2002 to 2012. (www.bls.gov/oco/oco1002.htm)

L.V.N. to R.N. Advance Placement

Advanced Placement is offered in the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing program to applicants who are currently Texas licensed Vocational Nurses, who have three months of work experience and who meet all the prerequisite course and admissions requirements for the program. Students accepted as Advanced Placement will receive nursing course credit for the first semester courses and will start in second semester of the degree program.

Entry through Advanced Placement is available in August and May with occasional seat offerings in January.
