The Baptist Health System School of Health Professions has been educating nurses since 1905. The school is located in the San Antonio, Texas Medical Center area. The Master of Science in Nursing with a Concentration in Nursing Administration is a completion degree for Registered Nurses who hold a current nursing license and who have previously completed a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. The program is being implemented to respond to a national call for healthcare reform and recommendations that nurse's practice with higher levels of education (IOM Report 2010)

Master's Nursing Education

The Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Nursing Administration is a traditional post-baccalaureate completion degree. The program builds on undergraduate competencies and prepares the registered nurse with the knowledge and skills to practice as a nurse administrator within complex, changing systems. The MSN with a concentration in Nursing Administration has two curricula components, core courses and concentration courses. The four core courses provide a foundation for the seven concentration courses that focus on the knowledge and skill needed for the nurse to function as an administrator. The Master's program is based on the established guidelines and standards for master's level nursing programs. They include the Essentials of Master's Education in nursing (2011), Nursing Administration Scope and Standards (2009) and the Nurse Executive Competencies (2015).

Make a Difference with a Career in Nursing

Mastered prepared RN's with a concentration in a Nursing Administration are prepared to serve in a variety of managerial and leadership roles in all areas of practice.

U.S. salaries generally range from \$57,000 to \$122,000 (head nurses/clinical specialists). Today's job prospects in the San Antonio region are good, with the average MSN nurse salary for Mid-Career nurses at \$77,370. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics the demand for Master's prepared Registered Nurses is expected to grow by as much as 31%. Applicants for admission to the Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Nursing Administration must hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from an educational institution whose accreditation is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) or Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). All applicants must hold a valid unencumbered RN license in the state of residence and be currently employed in a healthcare setting. Applicants must also have a 3.00 grade point average in all upper division nursing courses.
