To be eligible for the BSN program, you must meet the following requirements.

Application Checklist

All application requirements must be completed and submitted by the application deadline. Applications that are missing any of the following application requirements will not be considered.

1.	Complete online application for the BS Nursing program via the BSHP website (Online Application). (Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.) Do not send transcripts until you have submitted your application.
2.	Submit electronic transcripts or mail All Official college transcripts. Baptist School of Health Professions Student Services 8400 Datapoint Drive, San Antonio, TX 78229
3.	Submit a copy of your High School Diploma, High School Transcript, or GED certificate. If applicable, submit DD214 & Military transcripts (Per Department of Education & VA Regulations). Please see VA section below for further info.
4.	Submit a copy of your RN license. You can submit this by uploading it to your application, or by emailing a copy directly to your advisor.
5.	Email your Admissions Advisor to verify that your application has been properly submitted.

APPLICATION FAQs

PREREQUISITES:

- You must complete your prerequisite courses at another nationally accredited institution before you are eligible to apply to BSHP.
- The prerequisite courses are not offered at BSHP.

TRANSFER CREDIT:

- Generally, BSHP can accept transfer credit from most **accredited** institutions. Please email a copy of your unofficial transcript to your advisor for more specific information.
- The courses that can be considered for transfer credit are those designated as **General Education** courses which will vary between BSHP programs.
- General Education courses will be evaluated by your advisor to give you a personalized degree audit. Please email your unofficial transcripts to your advisor to have a degree audit performed.
- The BSHP program requires students to take two upper division (3000-4000 level) electives as part of the program. These can be transferred in if you have previously attended a four-year college or university and have taken Junior/Senior level coursework.

TUITION:

- Tuition will vary depending on how many **general education** courses can be transferred into the program.
