

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE NURSING (LVN TO RN BRIDGE)

Located in the Medical Center area, this is a program dedicated to educating professional, registered nurses (R.N.) since 1903. The Baptist Health System supports the Associate degree and emphasis is on working extensively with patients in or outside of hospitals. Students complete approximately 12 credit hours of designated basic college courses in the biological sciences at an accredited college of their choice prior to entering the School. The nursing program is completed in 4 semesters. Graduates are eligible to take the national licensure examination for registered nurses. The program is accredited by the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools (ABHES), approved by the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas and licensed by the Texas Workforce Commission.

The School has a history of consistently high pass rates on the national licensure examination, and graduates are highly respected and desired by employers throughout the city, state, and nation. Classes are small, permitting attention to individual student learning needs. The entire faculty is educated at the master's level with nursing expertise in their teaching fields. The relationship with the Baptist Health System allows students to learn in some of the most modern and well-equipped hospitals in the Southwest.

Make a Difference with a Career in Nursing

Registered Nurses have the opportunity to make a difference in many lives. R.N.'s promote health, prevent disease, help patients/families cope with illness, and work in a wide variety of settings. Nurses should be caring and sympathetic, able to accept responsibility, make decisions, and work with and supervise others. They need physical and emotional stability to cope with human suffering, emergencies, and other stress. Salaries generally range from \$50,800 (entry-level) to \$106,530 (head nurses/clinical specialists.) In May 2018, the median annual wage for registered nurses was \$71,730. Today's job prospects in the San Antonio region are good, with employment opportunities expected to grow faster than the average for all occupations. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics the demand for Registered Nurses is expected to grow by 12% from 2018 to 2028. (www.bls.gov/ooh/)

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Admissions Requirements

- Anatomy & Physiology I (4 semester credit hours)
- Anatomy & Physiology II (4 semester credit hours)
- Microbiology (4 semester credit hours)

Prerequisite courses must meet the following criteria:

- Must be taken at an accredited college or university prior to applying.
- Must be passed with a grade of C or higher.
- Must be taken with a lab component (4 semester credit hours).
- 7-year expiration date unless you are working in direct patient care.

**** Applicants for the LVN to RN bridge program must hold a valid, unencumbered LVN license. All other applicants may apply to the traditional RN (AAS Nursing) program. ****

TEAS VI Entrance Exam

Applicants must register for and pass the TEAS VI Entrance Exam with the following minimum scores:

- **Reading:** 69
- **Math:** 63.3
- **Science:** 45.8
- **English:** 60

Retesting policy:

Applicants can take the TEAS test no more than two times in a 6 month period AND must wait a minimum of 30 days before testing a second time AND have a maximum of 3 total attempts.
